1. OVERVIEW

TPXimpact Limited ("TPXimpact") is running the West Yorkshire Combined Authority Mayor's Big Ideas Challenge – Young People ("the Challenge"). This involves the collection and processing of personal data for Applicants and, when applicable, their Parents/Guardians. Applicants will be shortlisted to become Finalists who participate in the Challenge. Finalists who win the Challenge will be Prize Winners. This Privacy Notice tells you what to expect us to do with your personal information when you apply for the Challenge.

This Privacy Notice and any other related documents are designed to ensure TPXimpact meets all our responsibilities and obligations under all relevant and applicable legislation such as the **Data Protection Act** 2018 (DPA) and the **General Data Protection Regulation** 2016 (GDPR).

3. WHAT INFORMATION WE PROCESS

We collect or use the following personal information as part of the process:

- Applicant contact details (E.g. name, address, telephone number, email address or emergency contact details)
- Parent/guardian details (E.g. name, telephone number, email address & relationship to Applicant)
- Age range and/or Date of Birth
- Identification (E.g. Drivers Licence or Passport)
- Gender
- Photographs (E.g. if you provide these as part of your application or for publicity)
- Video and audio (E.g. if you provide these as part of your application)
- Racial or ethnic origin
- Disabilities
- Accessibility needs
- Dietary needs



4. LAWFUL BASES AND DATA PROTECTION RIGHTS

Under UK data protection law, we must have a 'lawful basis' for collecting and using your personal information. There is a list of possible lawful bases in the UK GDPR. You can find out more about lawful bases on the ICO's website.

If you make a request, we must respond to you without undue delay and in any event within one month.

4.1. OUR LAWFUL BASES FOR THE COLLECTION AND USE OF YOUR DATA

Our lawful bases for collecting or using personal information is:

• **Consent:** you have given clear consent for us to process your personal data for a specific purpose. All of your data protection rights may apply.



- Legitimate interests we're collecting or using your information because it benefits you, our organisation or someone else, without causing an undue risk of harm to anyone. All of your data protection rights may apply, except the right to portability. Our legitimate interests are:
 - o Racial or ethnic origin & disabilities are collected for the sole purpose of monitoring the diversity of Applicants.
 - Accessibility data and dietary needs are collected to ensure the necessary support is provided to assist you whilst attending events and participating in the programme.
 - o Identification is used for the sole purpose of verifying identity and age of Applicants

5. WHERE WE GET PERSONAL INFORMATION FROM

We will only collect information that we have received directly from Applicants or their Parents/Guardians.

6. HOW LONG WE KEEP YOUR INFORMATION

We will only retain your personal information for as long as necessary to fulfil the purposes we collected it for, including for the purposes of satisfying any legal, accounting, or reporting requirements. Once the retention period has ended we will either permanently delete or anonymise all records associated with you.

Data category	Retention period
Name & Age Range	Applicants & Finalists: 6 months after the end of the entire Challenge. Prize Winners: Up to 2 years for promotional use.
Photos	Up to 2 years for promotional use.
Identification	This is viewed to verify identity and age but is not retained.
All other data	1 month from the end of the Challenge to which you have applied.
